There are plenty of methods to watch free movies online, but not all are legal or secure. We've included a list below the most reliable websites that allow you to watch movies online without spending a penny. Here's our list of the best places to go for a free (and safe) streaming fix. Additional guides to major players Sony Crackle, Crackle, or Crackle Plus once known simply as Crackle, a free streaming site that has undergone almost as many name changes as P. Diddy. Initially controlled by Sony, it is now a joint venture between Sony and Chicken Soup for Soul Entertainment (CSS). The newer IMDb TV for this manhunt is an Amazon-owned IMDb TV (formerly known as FreeDive). It offers free programs and movies supported by masters. In February 2020, the service acquired the rights to more than 20 Disney-owned series, including Lost, Desperate House, Malcolm in the Middle and My So-Called Life. It's also the only site that frees you to stream lost and malcolm in the middle for free. Other TV shows in her relatively small library include The Fringe, Heroes, Quantum Leap and Legal Veterans. The films include Memento, La La Land, Drive, Munster, Donnie Darko, Dune, illusionist, The Zodiac, Remez and more. If you're cruising through the site's selection of 4K/HDR cables, there are even one or two free options to watch. You still need a Vudu account, but you can create one for free. The Vudu app has been supported by a mul wealth of platforms, including Roku, Apple TV, game And, in addition, there is an app for most mobile devices. Vudu is only available in the U.S. Hoopla How it is for a good deal: Sign up for a library card and get free downloads or streams of movies, no ads at all. That's the deal when you use Hoopla, a digital media streaming platform that has partnered with local libraries to allow members to access content for borrowing online. It's similar to Overdrive, but with more than just eBooks and audiobooks. The availability of any given title will depend on your location and the number of copies available for download, but we found some surprisingly reasonable films when we checked in August 2020. Streaming will work on any device with a browser, while downloads require the Hoopla app on a mobile device. Not every library currently supports a knockdown, so make sure you ask a question. So far, libraries in the U.S. and Canada have access to the download. This YouTube one is not a brainer. Everyone knows that YouTube is the largest video hosting service on the Internet, and you're probably already using the site for stupid cat videos and footage of people being hit with exercise balls. It is available worldwide, although title selection will vary widely by region. You can access a collection of movies and shows from a browser, or on any myriad of devices that support Plex client software, like Apple TV, Roku, Smart TVs, etc. All you need is a free Plex account and you're good to go. For those who already use Plex as their media server, you can add the free people-supported options to existing server categories, making the experience completely seamless. Pluto TV Although it may not be known as the services above, Pluto TV still deserves your attention. Not only does it host free on-demand movies, but it's also a free live TV streaming service that hosts content edited from across the internet. While the channels are changing wildly, we're focused on movies here. Pluto TV currently features multiple live movie channels, perfect if you want to watch something but don't know what. There are two general-purpose movie channels, with the rest focusing on specific genres or categories, including action movies, action movies, Rage movies, Horror 24/7, classic films, black cinema, gravitas films and shelter. The service works in the U.S., as well as in many international locations. Pluto TV's on-demand film library is relatively small and frequently revolving, but offers just as many variety as its live movie channels. It is also available on tons of devices in addition to your computer, including apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Roku devices, and more. There are plenty of rare gems to watch here, and since the founders have worked to establish dozens of partnerships, there are also plenty of different streaming devices that support free SnagFilms. The service is now available as a free app for iOS and Android, but it is also compatible with various Roku devices, Kiplas, and a line of other streaming devices. The main site is also a breeze to navigate. Snagfilms is available worldwide, but some titles are only available in the U.S. and Canada. Kanopy Just like Hoopla, Kanopy is not only free to use, but it's also commercially free if you have a library card. Originally founded in 2008 in Australia as an educational tool, Canopi now offers a library of over 30,000 films through its partnerships with more than 200 libraries. There's a heavy focus on free independent films and documentaries (the company even has access to many recent films from the A24 catalogue), but you'll find all sorts of films available, and even more en route thanks to a deal that will see director Fred Weissman's entire catalogue come into service.
